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**NOTICES OF MOTIONS**

**I. Hon. Hengari:**

That this Assembly –

*Debates* the following and the Motion be referred to a Parliamentary Standing Committee for further scrutiny and report back.

Namibia is confronted with a significant economic and cultural challenge, with over 80% of music aired on local radio stations originating from foreign sources. This trend directly contributes to a considerable outflow of royalties, resulting in the financial marginalization of Namibian artists. The ramifications of this trend extend beyond mere financial losses, impeding the growth and sustainability of our vibrant local creative industry. By prioritizing foreign content, we restrict opportunities for job creation within our own borders.

Additionally, the cultural impact is significant. Foreign content diminishes Namibia's cultural identity, limiting the portrayal of local stories in our media. This erosion of cultural distinctiveness underscores the importance of Parliamentary intervention to safeguard and celebrate Namibian culture.

## II. **Hon. Mootu:**

That this Assembly –

*Demands* the urgent and transparent accountability from the government concerning its commitments and performance in financially supporting entrepreneurship and startup ecosystems. That it challenges the adequacy of current funding mechanisms and government's role in nurturing young entrepreneurs, who are pivotal to innovative growth and economic diversification.

This Motion calls for an immediate, detailed report from relevant government bodies detailing expenditures, outcome, and efficacy of all youth targeted entrepreneurial funding initiatives. Furthermore, it insists on a strategic restructuring if current measures are found lacking, mandating the creation of aggressive, well-funded programs tailored to empower youth business ventures.

This Motion is intended not merely to question but to provoke significant enhancement in government policy, ensuring that youth entrepreneurship is not just supported but prioritized as a cornerstone of national economic strategy. Through this, the Motion aims to catalyse substantial, actionable change, positioning young entrepreneurs at the forefront of our economic future.

## III. **Minister of Agriculture, Water and Land Reform:**

That this Assembly –

*Discuss and Adopt* the establishment of communal land in the Khomas Region, for the /Khomani Traditional Authority and for the administration of the said communal by the Khomas Communal Land Board to be established to allocate land rights in terms of the Communal Land Reform Act, 2002 (Act No: 5 of 2002), as amended.
